


John Waterhouse of the Township of Hipperholm, bur. 13 Sep. 1660. Michael Waterhouse of Pontefract and Selby, Gent.; Elizabeth owner of lands in the parish of Halifax; will dated Executrix to her 11 May 1692; proved at York; bur. at Pontefract husband's will John, bp. 1619. dated 29 May 2 Nov. 1697. O. Heywood in his Obituary says he 1705. was aged 80. Richard Lapidge of Pontefract, Gent. Ann Waterhouse.* Ann Lapidge, the other coheir, Esther Lapidge, coheir, Elizabeth Lapidge, dau. & coheir, mar. in 1711 to mar. at Sandal Magna mar. John Kiplin of Ack-1710 to Isaac Wilkinworth, Gent., & d. without John Milnes of Wakeissue (see PED., p.); she d. a widow, aged 76, & was bur. field, Mercht, brother to son of Warley, co. A Waterhouse, terfield in Fig. 1665; mar. at Pontefract 8 Jan. 1697; d. 8 April 1728, & was bur. at Chesterfield.

John Waterhouse of Ponte—Ann Ashfract, son & heir-apparent, d. in the lifetime of his father, & was bur. in the Ch. of Pontefract 23 March 1691.

Christopher Wilkinson of Little Horton—Ann Waller, mar. at Bradnear Bradford, co. York, a Clothier. ford 26 June 1637.

Isaac Wilkinson¹ of Little Horton, bp. at Bradford—Elizabeth Thackray, d. 2 Feb. 17 Aug. 1656; d. 29 August 1742, aged 87, & was bur. bur. in the Dissenters' burial ground at Bradford. with her husband.

¹ We have no other proof of Isaac being the son of Christopher than the Register of his baptism. It is scarcely likely that two children, both named Isaac Wilkinson, should be b. at Little Horton about the same time. It is, however, probable that Ann Waller might not be the mother, but some second wife of C. W.
